1.Objectives

The course gives an introduction to the field of international macroeconomics, emphasizing theoretical concepts and their empirical evaluation. We will study exchange rate determination, the transmission of business cycle shocks, monetary policy in open economies, and balance of payments crises.

The course is aimed at second-year Master students with an interest in Macroeconomics or International Finance. It is not intended for doctoral students or Master's students in the PhD track.

Students are recommended to have taken courses in Macroeconomics and Econometrics and an interest in mathematical economics and econometrics is a prerequisite. The material will be largely self-contained, as techniques that go beyond Bachelor-level economics will be elaborated at an informal level as needed.
